The Centennial Concert Band, headed up by music teacher Paul Brisley and the Centennial Choral Ensemble will be playing at the Remembrance Day assembly at 9 a.m. The Centennial Choral Ensemble is then traveling to the Cenotaph to take part in the ceremonies. Gill who did a superb job chairing the committee. Thanks as well to the many individuals, businesses, organizations and service clubs who were most generous in providing 76 awards for our grads.

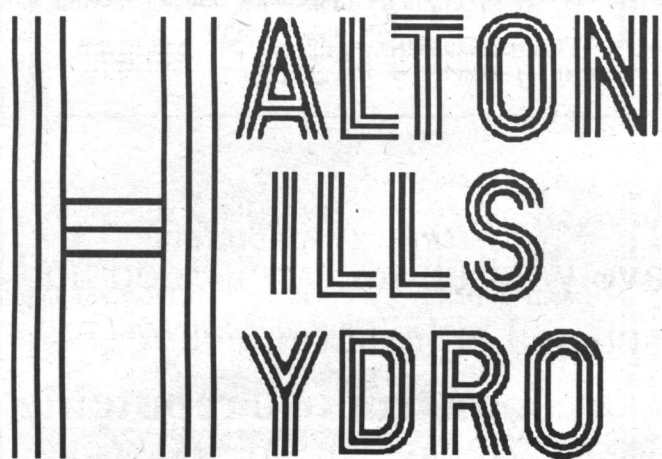
I must not, a highlight of the evening was Chris Adamo's valedictorian address, which had the appropriate blend of advice, nostalgia and humor.
