end zone, scored the only touchdown for the Rebels on the day in the fourth quarter but it wouldn't be enough on this day.

Marinangeli credited his team with a solid effort despite some injuries late in the game, but questioned the commitment of some of the team members throughout the year at practices.

"Some of the guys don't

have the philosophy of what it takes to play on a football team. Guys were missing practices all year making it seem like they were optional. You just can't do that, I had to bench two guys for the game because they missed practices."

Marinangeli however thinks that this year's squad was not a 0-6 team but rather a .500 team and that may

show next year.

"There are a lot of lineman returning next year, (quarterback) Paul Ingram got better as the year went on and with perhaps a new offensive set up, this team will improve.

"If they are serious about playing, it's going to take more of a commitment by the players next year," concluded Marinangeli.
