

A 'Time to Remember' lost loved ones at special ceremony

Georgetown and District Memorial Hospital has developed a program that goes beyond addressing simply the medical needs of the commu-

nity. Now in its second year, the memorial service 'A Time to Remember' is designed to give members of the community an opportunity to honor the memory of loved ones

who have died at Georgetown Hospital. The next 'Time to Remember' ceremony will be held Thursday from 12:15 to 1:15 p.m. in the hospital boardroom.

According to Eunice McGowan, head of Social Work at the hospital, "Providing medical services is one aspect of meeting the

health care needs of our community. We also recognize the important role spiritual and emotional well-being has in our health.

"Through our memorial service, Georgetown hospital gives individuals the chance to not only share their feelings with caring and understanding relatives and friends, but allows them to mourn - a

key factor in the healing process," McGowan outlines.

While the loss is difficult for family and friends of the deceased, hospital staff grieve as well. "Medical personnel develop a close relationship with patients and their families. As a result, this 'Time to Remember' memorial service enables our staff to lend support to each other," says McGowan.

The memorial service is a joint effort of the institution's

Pastoral Care and Social Work Services and is similar to others held regularly in hospitals throughout North America.
