

The evening will be hosted

by organizer, Jim Broughton, who will encourage sing-alongs to the Canadian folk songs of Stan Rogers and Gordon Lightfoot.

Well-known pianist, music director and teacher, Haydn Evans, will draw on his large repertoire to offer a mix of classical and modern music.




use the medium. It will be an excellent opportunity for those who are enjoying the increasing popularity of this historic art form to see a juried show of new and established pastel painters.
