

Byckowski eyes Canuck talent

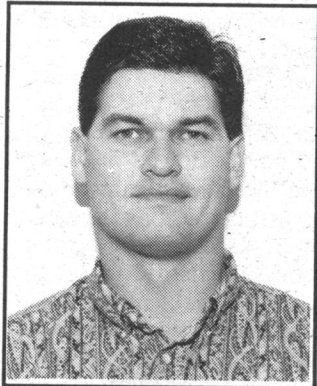

Georgetown resident Bill Byckowski has been named the new Director of Canadian Scouting for the World Champion Toronto Blue Jays.

Byckowski, 32, born in Toronto and raised in Brampton, got the position when long-time Canadian head scout Bob Prentice accepted a promotion with the Jays.

"I found out a couple of weeks ago and I knew it was coming. Last September I went through the interview process along with nine or 10 others and got the job," said Byckowski.

Byckowski has been scouting for just over a year

and isn't that far done from his playing days.

In '87 Byckowski was a member of the Canadian team that played in the Pan Am games and was also a member of the Olympic team in '88.

Byckowski will be in

charge of 20 scouts searching out talent from across Canada who will report back to him on prospects.

"We've got people all over and they narrow down the list of players who have been scouted.

"We see what stage they're at and then we slot them along with the American players and from there we figure out if we want to draft them in the 2nd, 8th or 12th round. It all depends," he said.

Right now is a slow time for Byckowski, who is involved in paper work and seminars. But after Christmas the scouting aspect starts again for him and the rest of the Jays scouts.

Nolan leads Rebels in regular season finale

Led by 18 points from Shannon Nolan, the Georgetown District High School junior Rebels girls basketball team advanced to the playoffs with a well earned 44-39 win over E.C. Drury at GDHS Tuesday.

Nicola Daykin was the dominant player in the first half scoring 12 of her 14 points for GDHS as both teams rebounded efficiently in a well paced opening quarter, that saw Daykin (6 points) and Nolan (5 points)

doing all the scoring for the Rebels.

With the Rebels up 11-10 going into the second quarter, E.C. Drury took charge capitalizing on Rebel mistakes on both the fast break and on defense giving Drury a 26-21 lead at the half.

GDHS improved moving the ball out of their own end in the third quarter, thanks to some great rebounding by Kate Potosky under the boards, as the Rebels defense held E.C. Drury to four points.

With Drury pressing

offensively, down 33-30 the Rebels were able to score 11 points in the fourth quarter as their rivals continually pinched the guards on offense leaving Nolan and the rest of the Rebels open down the court.

Both teams got into foul trouble late in the contest but the Rebels protected the lead for the win.

The junior Rebels finished the regular season at 5-4 and faced the same Drury squad in Milton Thursday in the playoff opener. Results weren't available at press time.

The senior team, which needed a win just to have a chance at making the play-

offs, came up short, dropping a close 35-31 game to the senior team from E. C. Drury.

Led by 10 points from Andrea McNeilly and eight from Alison Lipp, GDHS led at half time 16-12 in a very defensive game that never opened up until midway through the third quarter.


In the third quarter the Rebels came out flying scoring six points in the first 2:30, however it didn't last long as Drury took over and never looked back.

Drury went on to score 19 straight points through the third and fourth quarters surviving a spirited comeback attempt late by the Rebels.

Cull's defense key in Kingston

Trent Cull of Georgetown is presently playing his fifth year in the Ontario Hockey League with the Kingston Frontenacs and his aggressive defensive style is helping the Fronts challenge for top spot in the Leyden division.

The 6-foot-2, 210-pound defenseman has six points and 41 penalty minutes in 12 games with the second place Kingston club this year.

Cull, 20, attended the Boston Bruins training camp and the former Georgetown Chrysler Raider junior wasn't disappointed with being sent back to the OHL, saying this year with Kingston should be a good one.

"We should have a strong team that will challenge for the Memorial Cup. There will be better exposure," said Cull.

Last year with the Kingston club, Cull netted 12 goals and 28 assists along with 150 penalty minutes.
