Full-time plans examiner approved

To accommodate the concerns of the local construction community, Town of Halton Hills councillors decided Monday to increase building staff.

Councillors approved director of Building Code and By-law Enforcement, Henry Tse's, report to recruit a second full-time plans examiner for a two year contract basis effective Jan. 1, 1994.

During this time, the current plans examination workload backlog status will be included in monthly reports, to be presented during the upcoming construction season. If, at that time, a considerable backlog persists, an additional part-time plans examiner will be retained.

The report will be voted on this Monday at the Town of Halton Hills council meeting.

Development charges appeal

Georgetown resident Pat Fobert appealed to councillors at Monday's general committee meeting to overlook his Delrex Blvd. property for development charges because of a

promise made to him by the previous owner of the property that the charges were not applicable.

Town of Halton Hills treasurer, Andrew Koopmans, admitted Fobert's was a "unique situation" as it was the first formal appeal made in the municipality against the charges, and council had no mechanism in place to for appeals of this nature.

Koopmans added development charges were being applied because Fobert was interested in future growth-related projects. Fobert explained he is interested in selling the property but his price will depend on whether development charges will be applied.

Koopmans promised to look into establishing a mechanism to allow for development charges appeals, after which time Fobert can resubmit his grievance. Koopmans promised the report would be ready in "several weeks."

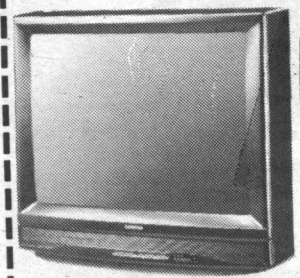
