AQUATICS

Registrations for Winter swimming lessons will be accepted at the Civic Centre at any time by mail, drop-off or fax, however they will not be processed until the DEADLINE OF TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 30 AT NOON. Registration forms are randomly selected by our computer following the deadline date. Confirmations will be mailed to all participants after Dec. 17. (If your child is currently enrolled in Fall lessons, check with their instructor as to the next appropriate level.) If you have a Family Card number don't forget to write it on the form.

Due to the popularity of swimming lessons, registrations from residents of Halton Hills will be processed with priority. Out-of-town registrations will not be processed until December 7.

RATE INCREASE

A 1994 Rate Increase has come into effect for all 1994 Aquatic Programs. They are now as follows: 1/2 Hour \$27.50; 3/4 Hour \$40.70; 1 Hour \$55.00 and Adult \$29.43. Please submit the appropriate fee amount when registering.
