

Halton Youth dart league is off to a stutter-start

Sunday saw the almost abortive start of the Halton Youth League at the Charley's establishment. After the one/off/on again start only one or two showed up. However, the big start will be this Sunday coming at noon at the same location.

The senior section played as usual on Monday with some good results. Legion #3 returned to the winning post with 10-3 over Charleys #1. Bracky's boys battled away against Ravine and pulled off a win by 8-6. Royal Pizza moved up the standings in winning 8-6 over a stubborn Copper Kettle. Time

Out #1 won 8-6 over Legion #1 and Legion #2 took out Charley's #2 by 8-6. However, the match of the week belongs to Legion #2 and Charley's #2.

The almost all-female team of Legion #2 won their first match of the season, all the wins coming from the girl's darts. The lone male on the team, Roger Armstrong, did not register a point. Mike Hope's four won the first teams and Arlene Hope's replied for the girls. Gord Bottoms defeated Roger Armstrong in the fourth singles with Mike Hope and Rob Campbell winning, before Rena Gray

sent Todd Axford packing. Then Cindy See, Lisa Rhynold, Robin McLure and Barb Hope defeated Sherri Reid, Jim and Paul Clarke and Deanna Jackson to lead after the singles. The doubles matches were tied 2-2 to leave the Legion team ahead by two at the close.

Single high scores came from Cindy See, Barb Hope and Donna Ripley for the Legion, with Gord Bottoms replying for Charley's. Pete Pickering notched a 180, Neil Olmstead finished 121 and Paul Mousseau closed 140. 140 was also the high score of the night; Dave Scutt and Bruce Hope each getting a double. Three high scoring bonus' were earned by Ian McDonald, with doubles from Wyman Somers, Ken Gritten, Jack Hamilton and Russ Hillier.

In the Industrial League, Dream Team continue front-runners, chased by Hustlers mainly, with Westenders, Ensigns, Gasketman cutters and Steeprock waiting for a slip up or three from above. Four wins by 7-2 last week, Dream Team, Hustlers, Hotshots and Steeprock. The biggest win went to Westenders, by 8-1 and Acadian Pools - same score. Ensigns and Panthers made the closest result of the night with a 6-3 win for ensigns.

Darts

Ensigns boast the two oldest players in the league in Roy Rudiger, 74, and Harry Bottoms, an early 70ish. Unusually for Rudiger, he only had one start and two closes on the night with Bottoms coming in with two starts. And, no high scores or finishes, a quiet night for the oldsters.

Al Murphy had three starts and two finishes. For the opposition Paul Kavanagh made a telling contribution with five starts and Henry Graham had a two-two match.

The opening four sets were evenly distributed. It looked like being a close match. Then Ensigns took three in a row to set up the win. The last two sets were tied in a fine match.

The high start of the night was 120, Mike Pepper doing it twice, Mike Hope and John Burke opening once. 140 was the high score and Ray Ackroyd and Al Gardner were the scorers. Joe Poirier scored 134 and Mike Finn scored 132. Terry Hancock recorded the high close of 78 for the night.

Five starts seemed to be the main opening and Joe Cairns, Ted Musgrove and Paul Kavanagh achieved these. Four starts for Ron Scarlet, Brian Hicks and Trevor Campbell. Four finishes for Don X of Bullsitters with several

players notching three.

Many of the jolly captains are not completing the bottom section of the game sheet, which is where the column picks up most of the individual starts. Fill them up, boys, your players are not being mentioned!

Most, if not all, of the major players around the globe, in the pro ranks of course, practice between six and eight hours a day. Then they are off tournamenting or exhibiting all over the place. The game may not have the TV dollars it once had, which is a pity. However, there are still a lot of dollars and other currencies in the game with tournaments.

Ideas for practice? After a few non-discriminating

throws for warm up settle down for real practice. Try to beat your own score, each time you throw. See how many times you succeed.

Throw at your favorite double, then go around the board in doubles. Three darts at each double in numerical sequence.

Always finish with three darts at the bull. Throw two darts at one number and one at the opposite of the board (16 to 18 for example). Try to go under your last score, see how many times you succeed. Throw a "game" of 101, 201, 301, 401 and see how many darts it takes. Play with a partner at these or fun games.

Any way you do it, keep doing it.

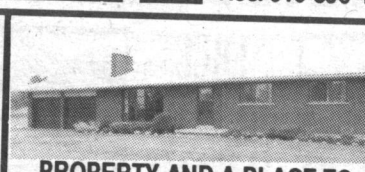
