The Halton Board of Education and the Ontario Secondary Schools Teachers' Federation have reached an agreement on the implementation of the Social Contract.

Secondary Schools will be closed on Friday, Feb. 4 and Thursday and Friday, Mar. 10 and 11, 1994. The Ministry required that the teachers' days off without pay be taken before March 31. The March dates are the two days prior to our March Break.

A letter went home with the students on Monday explaining to parents there will also be a one-day adjustment in the exam timetable as a result of this agreement.

Students are now expected to be available for exams between Monday, Jan. 24 and Monday, Jan. 31 inclusive. Exams will be returned to students Tuesday morning, Feb. 1, between 9 a.m.

## Duignan plans meeting with newly-elected MPs

Noel Duignan, MPP for Halton North, has extended an invitation to the three Halton area federal members of parliament to attend a meeting to discuss federal-provincial issues.

Duignan contacted Julian Reed, MP for Halton-Peel; Bonnie Brown, MP for Oakville-Milton and Paddy Torsney, MP for Burlington and indicated he was looking forward to a more cooperative era of representation.

In his invitation, Duignan referred to how badly Ontario has been affected by the practices and policies of the pre-

vious federal government. "Premier Rae has called upon Prime Minister Jean Chretien to reverse the current discrimination against Ontario", wrote Duignan. "He has also called upon the new federal government to join with ours in creating jobs, renewing manufacturing, and investing in people and technology."

Ontario is already investing, almost \$4 billion a year in putting people back to work and has provided financing for a number of infrastructure and other projects in Halton Region, claimed Duignan.

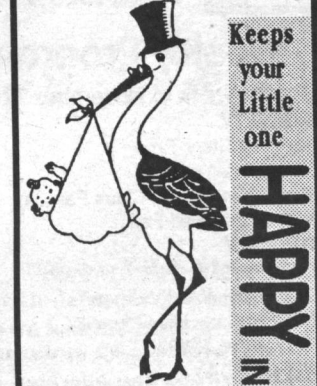

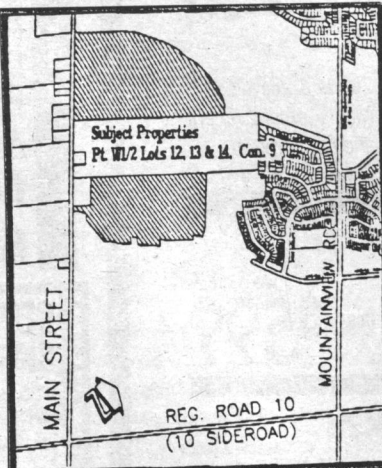
