Rebel swimmers swamp invitational meet

It was a very successful weekend for the Georgetown District High School Rebels swim team, as they traveled to Hamilton's McMaster University for an invitational meet.

The GDHS boys were the overall winners while the girls placed second, thanks to some great team and individual efforts.

GDHS was first in the girls 15-and-under Individual Medley 200 relay and the 15-and-over 200 I.M. relay. The 15-and-under team finished in a time of 2:06.52, 12 seconds ahead of second place Ancaster, and the girls 15-and-over came in first in 2:24.10.

In the girls open 200 freestyle, Sabrina Bassett and Justine Colton finished one, two, in times of 2:32.89 and 2:43.60 respectively.

Kristen Herner came in third in the girls Open 50 butterfly in 35.50, while Leigh

Shillington and Andrea Herner finished third and fifth respectively in the girls 100 I.M. Open.

Sabrina Bassett finished second in the girls open 50 freestyle while Jenn Apgar was 32nd, Amanda Walker 39th and Amy Sargent 47th out of 53 swimmers.

Andrea Herner was third in the girls open 100 backstroke finishing in a time of 1:18.79. Justine Colton was 8th, Tracy Tabucki 12th and Amy Sargent 15th.

Karen Mathiasen was 8th in the girls 100 breaststroke in a time of 1:40.95.

Kristin Herner and Leigh Shillington were second and third in the girls 100 freestyle finishing in 1:08.44 and 1:10.52. Kathy Dugas was 13th in a time of 1:24.39.

GDHS finished sixth in the senior girls 200 free relay in a time of 2:23.80, while the junior girls took fourth in the 200 free relay in a time of 2:32.09.

The boys 15-and-over 200 I.M. relay was an exciting race as GDHS edged Parkside by 9/10s of a second to win in a time of 2:03.6.

Kevin Taylor was first in the boys open 200 freestyle winning easily in a time of 2:13.58, 13 seconds ahead of the second place finisher.

Robert Weston won the boys 50 butterfly in 28.10 while Trevor Charles came finished ninth in 34.54.

Nick Farmatte, Micah Zarnke and Cameron Charles finished fourth, sixth and seventh respectively in the boys open 100 I.M..

Glen Oomen led the GDHS boys in the 50 freestyle open, winning the race in an impressive time of 25.97. Taylor was third in 26.99, Cameron Charles was 15th, Osian Morgan 19th and Steve Masters was 26th out of 46 swimmers.

Neil Scudder was second in the boys 100 backstroke in

a time of 1:09.31 bare missing first place.

Robert Weston and Matthew Hardstaff were one two in the boys 200 I.M. times of 2:33.48 and 2:35.5 respectively.

Oomen won his second event of the day in the boys 100 freestyle winning the race in 58.08. Nick Laurot was third and Trevor Charles was eighth.

GDHS won the senior boys 200 free relay winning by five seconds over Appleby in a time of 1:48.67.

Zarnke took second place in the boys 200 breaststroke finishing in a time of 1:18.03.

GDHS also finished second in both the junior and senior mixed 200 free relay. The juniors finished the race in 2:23.85 and the seniors in 2:11.08.

The next swim meet for Rebels is Dec. 2 at Georgetown District High School.
