House finals provide great competition

Youth Bowling

The House Finals of the Provincial Combo Championships produced powerful competition among the 57 bowlers at Georgetown Bowl. Following the Georgetown Law - Learn to Bowl the Better Way - certainly provided "Bowl the Champion Way" results. The boys' division winners won by bowling 331 pins better than their average while the girls' section were 202 pins above their season average.

In this tournament, each team is made up of a bantam, junior and senior bowler according to standing achieved in each league round. In the girls' division, the winners were decided by only a two-pin margin. The team of Natalie Larocque, Leanne Neil and Suzanne Larocque started with a plus 165 while Kelly Klimsiak, April Everingham and Chantal Morley were close with a plus 129 and Cassandra Dew, Heather Pollock and Tara Brooks knocking on the door with a plus 112.

But, the final result came up with Klimsiak, Everingham, Morley trio a plus 202 to N. Larocque, Neil, S. Larocque trio 2 pins short with a plus 200. Nevertheless, the runners-up can move up to the champion team as replacements in case of an emergency.

With such outstanding team efforts, the two winning teams will now have an MBA coach assigned for the zone and provincial rounds.

The highest score of the tournament was by the senior boy, Ryan Martin who came through with a 302 game. Anyone wanting to bowl the champion way, join now for the next term.
