

# Money Talk with





### Is All This Fuel Dangerous?

The mutual funds industry is growing rapidly. In Canada the industry is near \$100 billion. It is expected to grow to \$300 billion by the year 2000.

Why all the growth?

First of all, low interest rates have made other traditionally acceptable investments poor performers. This year's Canada Savings Bonds were a good example. At four and a quarter percent, investors stayed away in record numbers.

Secondly, the fastest growing age group is between the ages of 40 and 55. This just happens to be the group with the largest proportion of money available for investments.

Thirdly, people are becoming more knowledgeable. A better understanding of the concept of risk as a time horizon now exists. As a result, people are more likely to invest in products that are capable of delivering results tailored to their particular needs.

The fourth reason is a world economy that, with few exceptions, appears poised to recover from recession all at once. At the same time the rate of growth is slow.

A fifth reason is that inflation is currently under control in the developed nations. This, coupled with the slow growth rate, is expected to produce a significant period of growth.

The final reason is that there is no other place to get a decent return.

The net result is people putting money into equity products as opposed to fixed income products. They are doing this more and more through mutual funds since this is a good way to achieve diversification and safety while letting a seasoned money manager do the stock pick-

With all this money one cannot help but wonder what the impact will be on fund performance and on the markets from which the fund managers buy.

Mutual funds are strongly regulated in order to protect investors. One way they are regulated is by restricting the size of a holding they are allowed. From the viewpoint of diversification this is a good thing. From the viewpoint of performance this may not be so good, at least in theory. If so much money is contributed to a fund that it has no choice but to invest in some stock that will not perform then this would be detrimental. Generally this seems not to be happening as different funds are created with varying mandates.

With all the money chasing stock it is possible for the fund companies themselves to push market values upwards. However, the total market mechanism with supply and demand seems to self regulate this situation as time goes by. We see more and more international diversification as another way to protect against this dilemma. In particular, Asian investing is currently brisk and we believe that European and real estate products will become as brisk shortly.

For those people wishing less volatile investments, international bonds and short term Canadian bonds are popular. These give better returns than GICs and they are more flexible and more liquid. They are great ways to balance portfolios.


