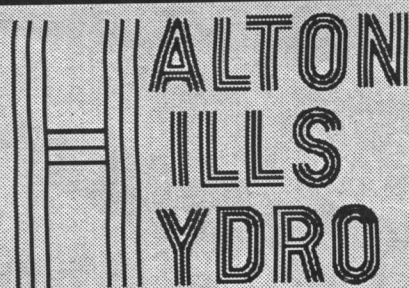
Truck found

Halton Hills Hydro is pleased to announce a **2% reduction in hydro rates**, effective January 1, 1994.* For a typical residential customer this equates to an approximate reduction of \$20 per year (or \$45 per year for a customer with electric heat).

As your local utility, Halton Hills Hydro buys power from Ontario Hydro. The wholesale cost of power from Ontario Hydro, which accounts for 86% of our expenses will remain at 1993 levels.
