Julie Roberts stars as Darby Shaw, a Tulane law student who, after hearing about the murder of two Supreme Court Justices, writes a paper called "The Pelican Brief"

In the Brief, she outlines a possible connection between the murders and who may have committed the crime. Needless to say, the Brief falls into the wrong hands, placing Shaw in danger.

"The Pelican Brief" marks Roberts' return to movie screens after a twoyear hiatus. She nary misses a beat as the young, innocent law student plunged into a game of deceit and murder.

Denzel Washington brings an authenticity to the role of Gray Grantham, a Washington Herald reporter who helps Roberts unearth the truth.

The original story by Grisham is flimsy to say the least. However, Pakula with his fluid camera and confident direction doesn't allow the material to completely sink back to its pop-litera-

The comparisons between "The Pelican Brief" and "The Firm" are unavoid-

What makes "The Pelican Brief" the superior film? Simple, there is an earnestness and sincerity in the performances by Roberts, Washington and Pakula that was not present in "The Firm". That makes "The Pelican Brief" a successful suspense thriller and worthy of your time and money.
