

Halton AAA Bantam Hurricanes are red hot

St. Catharines, Streetsville and Brampton ran into a hot Halton Bantam AAA Hurricane team which blew them out 6-4, 15-0 and 5-2 respectively. A 4-2 loss to Oakville kept them (the Hurricanes) from taking four games.

On Dec. 8 against St. Catharines, Halton opened the scoring early when Darin Finlayson flipped in a rebound from Dan Haw and David Sa. St. Catharines evened the score moments later. At 8:30 in the second,

Dundas' Steve Travers fired a net-seeking missile through a crowd to make it Halton 2, St. Kitts 1. Tom Baynton assisted. Their opponents scored two quick power play goals to go ahead 3-2 before Finlayson scored his second off a goal mouth tip-in with helpers from Haw and Baynton again.

The feisty St. Catharines team went ahead 4-3 late in the second before the hurricanes put them away in the third on unanswered goals by Sa, Haw and an open netter

by Kyle Martin. Assists were by Finlayson and Peter Mashinter. This game evened the series with St. Catharines after an early season loss. Haw, Travers and Finlayson had outstanding games.

Streetsville was no match for the locals as they met them Dec. 12 at Vic Johnson, pouring in 15 goals to earn a shutout for Geoff Beauparlant. Doug Janjevich sparked with four goals; Haw had a hat trick while Mashinter and Travers earned two apiece. Singles went to Martin, Ryan Taylor, Sa and Jason Fairclough. Assists on this goal harvest went to Finlayson, Fairclough and

Travers at three apiece with doubles from Justin Antoine, Martin and Steve Roy.

Against a much-improved Oakville team on Dec. 14, Halton suffered a 4-2 loss when it appeared early in the game they should win easily. Fairclough put Halton in the lead to open the first when he fired a great wrist shot that caught the top corner glove side assisted by Janjevich and Baynton. Oakville evened it up before the end of the period and then went ahead 3-1 on quick goals in the second. At 6:31 of the third Travers took a pass, spun around and beat the goalie for Halton's second goal; with Haw assist-

ing. Oakville put away the clincher with minutes left in the game to earn the victory. The locals were short two defensemen and it was evident in the flat second half of the game.


The Dec. 15 contest against Brampton featured end-to-end rushes before Halton emerged the 5-2 winner.
