Milk heists at Neilson's

Five men were arrested Monday as a result of an investigation into a scam involving the theft of unaccounted-for milk from Neilson Dairy on Guelph St. in Georgetown.

According to police, the milk was then sold to a Streetsville grocery store.

A 54-year-old independent truck driver for the company, a Scarborough resident, was taking extra milk and selling it to Foodport on Queen St. in Streetsville, police

He was charged with theft over \$1,000, possession over \$1,000 and conspiracy to possess stolen property.

Video surveillance revealed the thefts had been committed a number of times.

A 53-year-old stocktaker for Neilson's, a Guelph resident, helped load up the truck and was charged with the

Another male Guelph resident, an employee of the truck driver's who also delivered the stolen property, was also charged with the same three crimes.

The two owners of Foodport, a 43-year-old Mississauga man and a 34-year-old Mississauga man were charged with conspiracy to possess stolen property.
