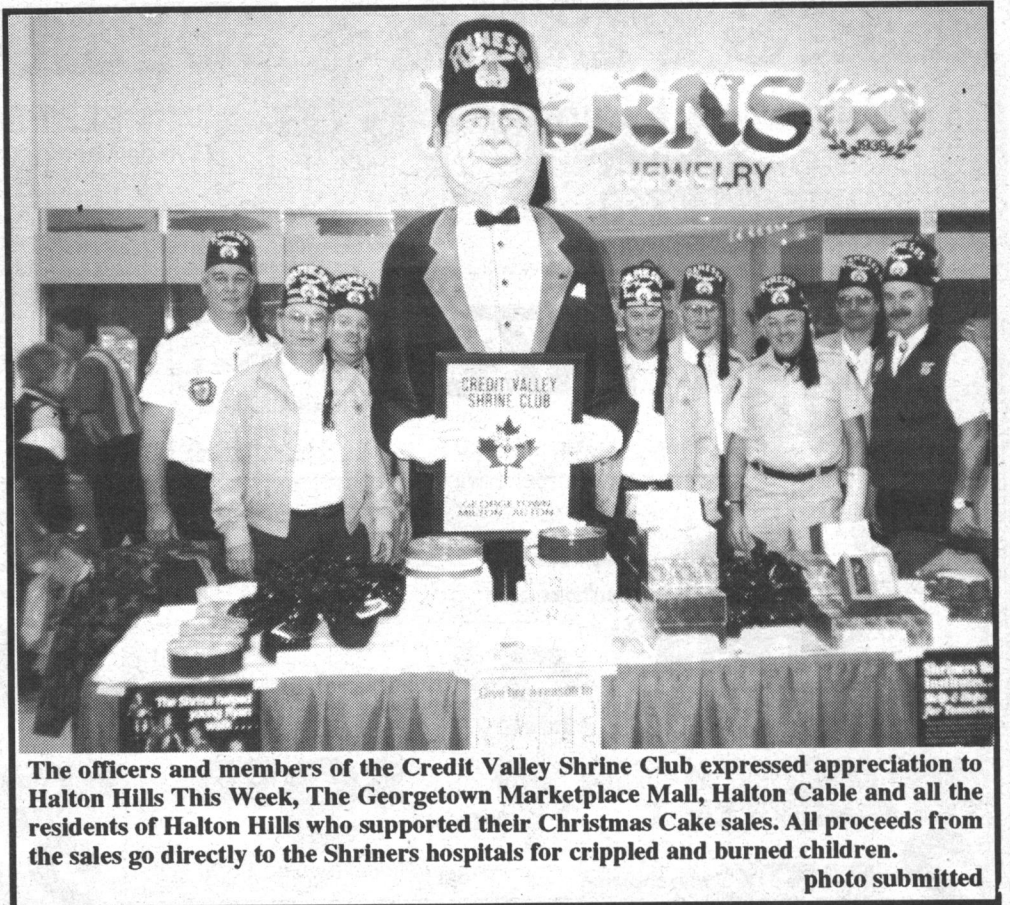
Many area residents visited Acton's Shoemaker Funeral Home this past week. Here they paid their last respect to Dorothy (Dot) Swindlehurst who had

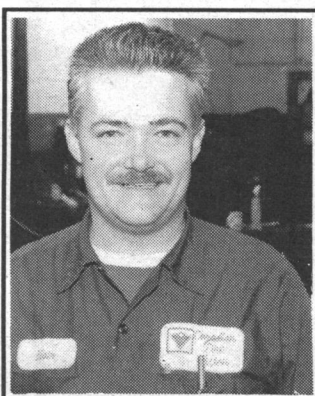
