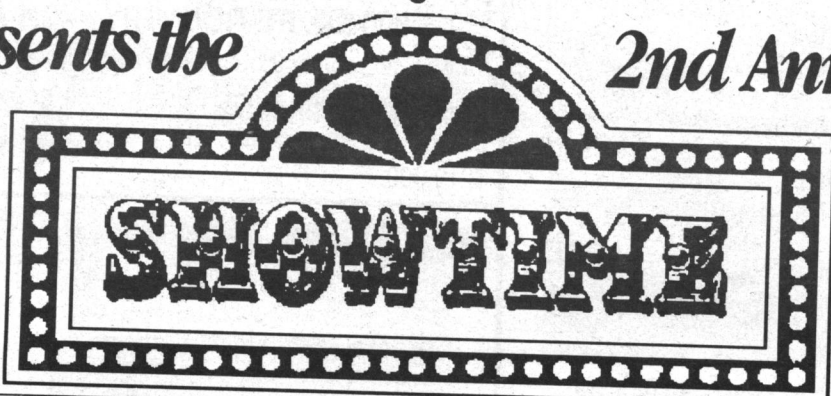

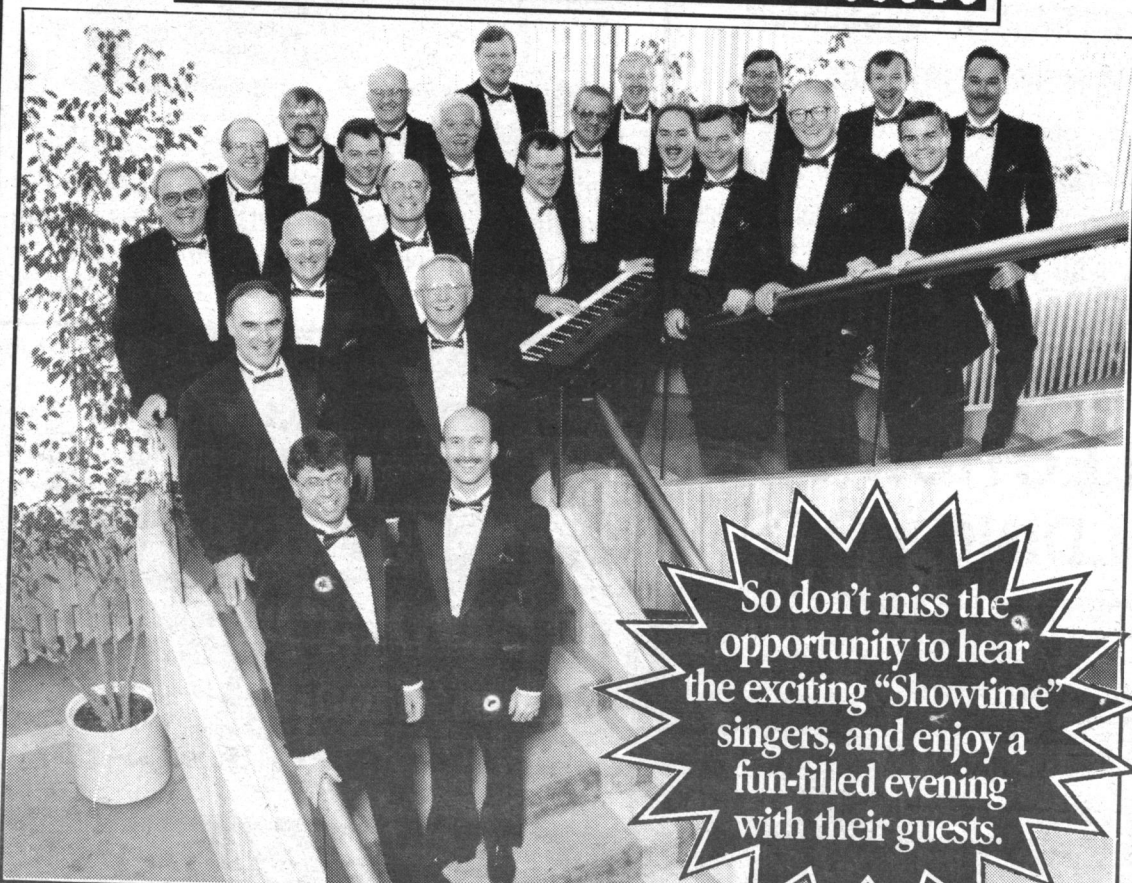

On Saturday, January 22, 1994, the Rotary Club of Georgetown will present "Showtime" - a music hall revue featuring the "Showtime" singers and guest artists.
