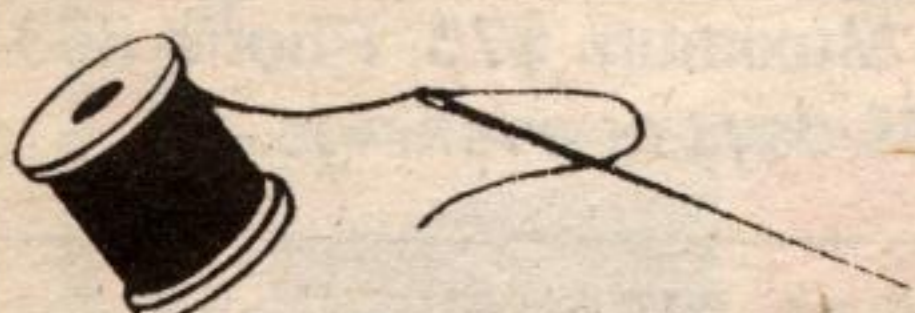

Rockwood youths compete

Thirteen students from Rockwood Centennial school competed at the second annual Erin Summer Olympics on Saturday.

Travelling to Erin were Mike Richards, Josh Slavin, Jake Slavin, Dan Buckland, Justin Davis, Blair Williamson, Kyle Straw, Brady Straw, Ellington Griffith, Dennis Wiggan, Michael Moffit and, last but not least, two girls — Linda Davis and Orissia Griffith. All first place winners came home with gold medals.

Gold Medal results: Mike Richards, competing in the Bantam Boys division, recorded a first in the 800 metres and a first in the

1,500 metres.

Dan Buckland, in the Bantam Boys division, recorded a first in the 400 metres.

Justin Davis, in the Atom Boys, had a first in the 50 metres, high jump and running long jump.

Brady Straw, in the Tyke Boys division, placed first in the 100 metres and running long jump.

Dennis Wiggan, in the Atom Boys class, recorded a first place finish in the 100 metres.

Linda Davis, in the Mite Girls division, recorded first place finishes in the running long jump, standing long jump, ball throw, 50 metres and 100 metres.

Mike Richards set a record in the 1,500 metre and Josh Slavin broke the meet record in the high jump. Justin Davis set a record in the 50 metre event and the running long jump. He had the third-highest record in all of Ontario in the high jump. There was not a jump this good since 1985. Kyle Straw broke the meet record in the 800 metres while Brady Straw broke the record in the 800 metre in his class. Dennis Wiggan set a new record in the 100 metres and Orissia Griffith set a new record in the 50 metres. Linda Davis set records in the running long jump, ball throw and 50 metre dash.

Acton Ladies Softball club has rough week, loosing four straight

In recent softball action, the Acton Ladies squad ran into some hot teams and sustained four straight losses.

After losing their first meeting with Acton, Georgetown (last year's champions) came out with a vengeance winning with a 13-1 score last Tuesday at Prospect Park.

Starting off in the first inning, Georgetown knocked out four hits and scored three runs against the Acton crew. In the second inning, while Acton committed four errors, Georgetown had six hits. By the time the inning ended, Georgetown had scored eight more runs to lead 11-0 over the locals.

Acton managed its only run of the game in the third inning when Helen Knowles led off with a homer over the center fielder's head.

Georgetown tallied two more runs in the latter innings to give them the win.

On Wednesday, the visiting Acton Ladies suffered another

loss, this time at the hands of a strong Hillsburgh side.

After giving up a run in the first inning, Acton trailed by only a 1-0 count until the fourth inning when Hillsburgh knocked out five hits and scored six runs. They added three more runs in the fifth for a commanding 10-0 lead.

Acton did manage to get a rally going in the sixth inning. Boo Tufford singled to centre and Suzi Tufford followed with a double. Mel Spear then cashed in Boo on a single, while Diane Hancock doubled to centre to score Suzi Tufford and Mardie Phillips singled to bring Spear home.

Acton recorded a hard-fought 6-4 loss over a visiting Caledon East squad on May 26. The day before in Cheltenham, Acton was defeated 2-1.

The Ladies' next game is tonight (Tuesday), when they will host Hillsburgh. Thursday the club travels to Caledon East. ■
