Fire stats worry Chief

 Halton Hills politicians want to know why there has been a significant increase in the number of fire calls and fire damage in Acton and Georgetown in recent months.

"I'm concerned about the 40 per cent increase in calls," says Chief Bill Cunningham. "We've had 70 more calls this year to date than for the same time last year."

"The number of calls started to jump for the first three months of the year; they've sort of levelled off but they are still up."

So far this year there have been 232 calls for fire service compared to 162 for the same period last year. Fire damage so far this year is

\$759,000 compared to \$273,500 for the same period last year.

The Fire Chief says the three-year fire statistics comparison requested by Town Council will show if things are way out of whack this year or if last year was simply a slow year.

Cunningham will not indicate if the extra calls are from Acton or Georgetown. "I'm not about to break the figures down. It is the Halton Hills Fire Department. I've struggled to make it one fire department and it's my responsibility to make sure it works."

"To look specifically at one community over the others just creates problems," the Chief says.

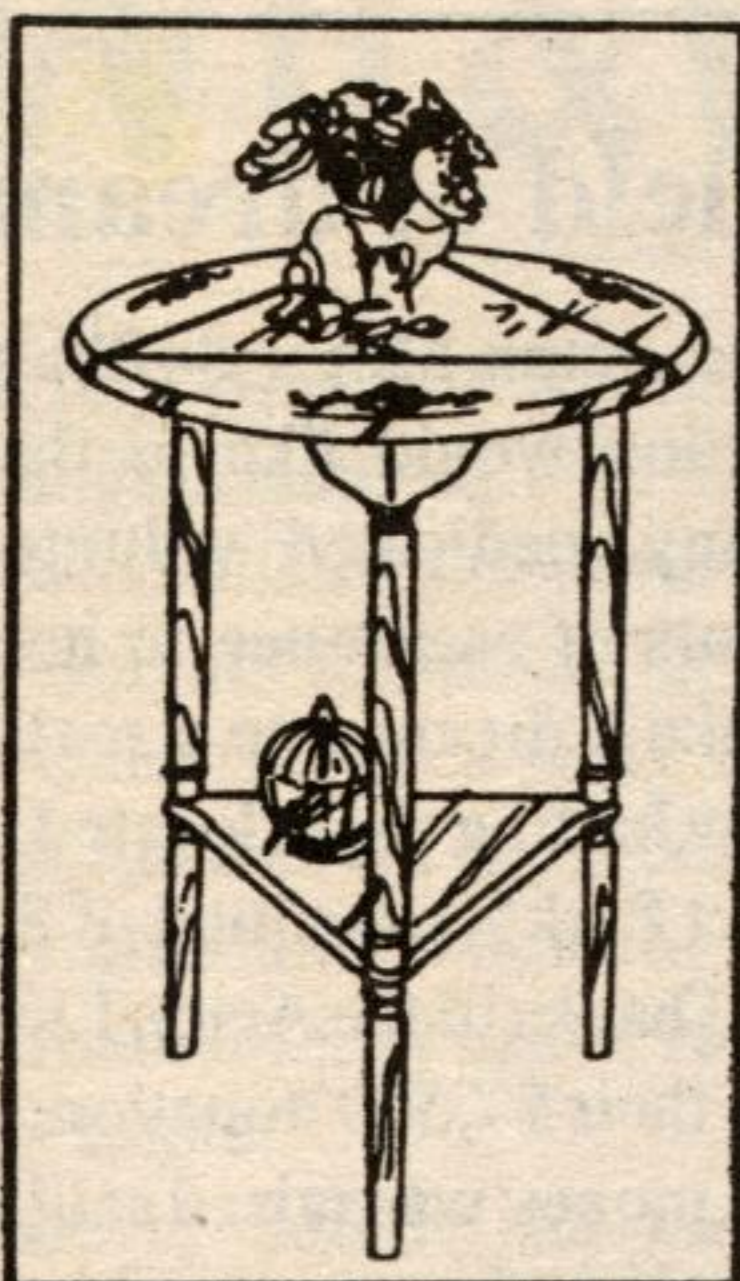

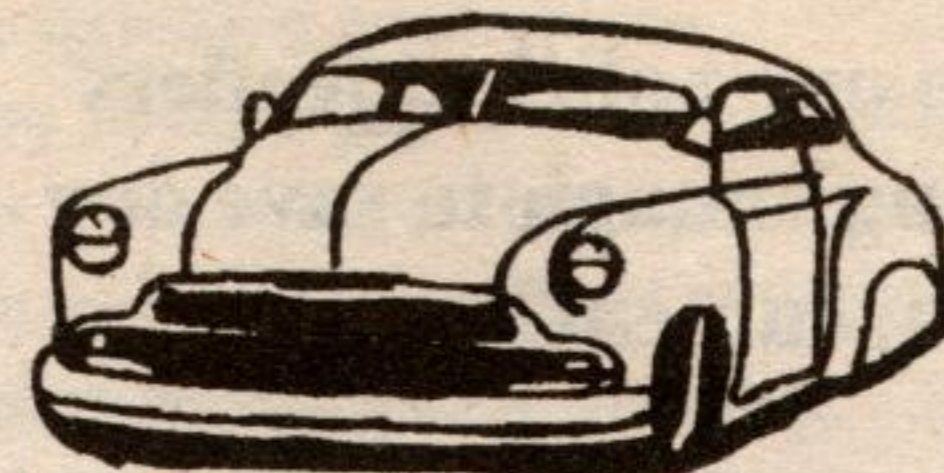

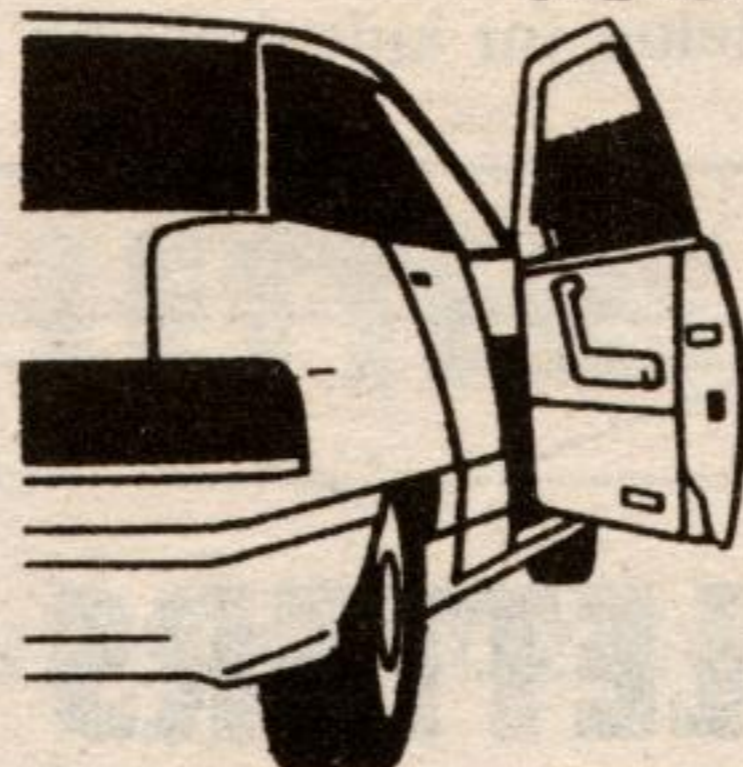
