Acton CCC plans fall meeting

Acton's Community Consultation Committee hopes to revive Neighbourhood Watch. Chair Bill Taylor said public awareness will be job one. "The committee will decide issues to focus on. I would like the police-in-action program expanded. It helped us solve police concerns and issues," noted Hallowe'en vandalism problems

downtown last year and this Hallowe'en will be a priority."

CCCs promote communication between police and community and make suggestions for preventive policing. "We want to publicize available law enforcement programs so everyone is aware of Taylor.

Acton CCC co-ordinator, Sgt. Al McWhirter adds: "We are calling people who were involved with the Acton Watch program a couple of years ago. But this is a community program and police don't sustain it; the public has to buy in.


