#### Drunk threatens cop's life

A 32-year-old Acton man has been charged with causing property damage following a drunken dispute outside The Meeting Place on Mill Street Saturday night. The suspect approached an officer outside the bar to complain that he had been assaulted by a bouncer. The drunk and aggressive suspect was asked to sit in the cruiser and refused to go home quietly after an investigation determined that no assault had occurred. Bar staff told police the suspect had refused to leave the bar when told to by staff. While being transported to the police station the suspect made several death threats against the police officer and did \$100 damage to the cruiser's rear door by kicking it.

#### B & Es at Mom's house

A young offender has been charged with break and enter and theft after a Mill Street East, Acton house was entered twice in 24 hours. Police report the first entry occurred Wednesday when the youth cut open a screen door while his mother and sister slept upstairs. Once inside, the youth removed the magnetic strip from the refrigerator door. Police suspect he intended to use it to try to get coins from vending machines. The next day the youth opened an unlocked window at the front of the house and removed \$50 from his mother's purse, another a magnetic strip from the fridge and a key to the house. The youth was arrested at a group home and charged.

#### Landlord-tenant dispute

An Acton man has been charged with threatening and assault following a dispute over unpaid rent on Saturday. Police say the victim was in a local coffee shop when the accused found her and started an argument. Police report the victim was a roomer at a rented house and the accused had stayed with her until he was unable to pay his share of the rent and she asked him to leave. Kenneth Murray of R.R. 1, Acton appears in court Wednesday, Oct. 21.

## Olde Hide House warns suspected shoplifter

An unemployed Willowdale man and three of his family members were warned by Halton police and told to leave the olde Hide House following an incident involving a \$19 wallet Sunday. Police report the suspect was seen walking around the store with a green leather wallet in his hand. Security observed the man put the wallet into a purse, try on some coats and then left the store to talk to a relative who was outside having a cigarette. Police say the suspect then ran back into the store to where another family member was paying for \$800 worth of leather goods.

After hearing the circumstances and learning that the suspect was a landed immigrant who had only been in Canada for two months and did not speak english it was decided that no charges would be laid. All four family members were given written trespass notices and told to leave the store and not come back.

#### Acton teens charged with stealing

Two Acton girls, both aged 14, will be in Milton Youth Court Monday, Oct. 19, charged with stealing make-up from the Woolco store in Georgetown. Police report store security observed one girl take a \$6 mascara and the second take \$7.38 worth of lipstick and mascara without paying for the items. The girls were stopped outside the store, arrested and charged and released to their parents.
