September and school. The two words are almost synonymous. Eager children look forward to the joys of learning and parents welcome the return of a routine.

For pre-schoolers, it is sometimes harder to find ways to keep them stimulated and amused. The Rockwood Nursery School which has been operating for 22 years is the answer. A cooperative nursery school is a group of parents working together to give their children a richer pre-school experience. The parents contribute by participating in the building/repairing/cleaning of toys and equipment. Because of parent participation, fees can be kept to a minimum; they cover rental of school space, teacher's salary, equipment purchase and supplies. Parents who choose the non-helping group pay a higher monthly fee but still participate in committees, meetings, field trips, etc.

Good communication is essential and parents maintain it by issuing a newsletter and having regular meetings where nursery school business is discussed. They also have guest speakers and parents are welcome to suggest topics of interest.

The school's objectives for the children include the opportunity for each child to:

- 1. gain a sense of self-worth and pride.
- 2. learn to trust the teacher, other adults and other children.
- 3. develop skills, such as cutting, pasting, climbing, singing, etc.
- 4. foster independence through being able to choose one's own activities, use materials properly and creatively.

Four separate classes are held weekly in the Rockwood Town Hall.

Group "A" - Mon. Wed. Fri. mornings - 9:30 - 11:45 a.m.

Group "B" - Tues & Thurs mornings - 9:30 - 11:45 a.m.

Group "C" - Mon & Thurs afternoons - 1:00 - 3:15 p.m.

Group "D" - Tues & Fri afternoons - 1:00 - 3:15 P.M.

Each group has 16 children, with one teacher and three assisting parents with the exception of group "D", which will have two teachers and A helper, as there are no helping parents.

Field trips are arranged throughout the year, and past trips to places such as Saunder's Bakery, Bronte Creek, Long Lane Orchards, The Arberetum, Schneiders Reliable Sweets Factory, to name just a few, have all added to the children's learning experiences.

Creativity takes many forms in many different areas of the classroom-dramatic play, block center, creative movement, singing, imaginative floor play. The nursery school's classroom and program is set up to challenge and stimulate the child's creative imagination so that no matter where the child plays the potential for creativity exists.
