colourful entries. Watch for it!

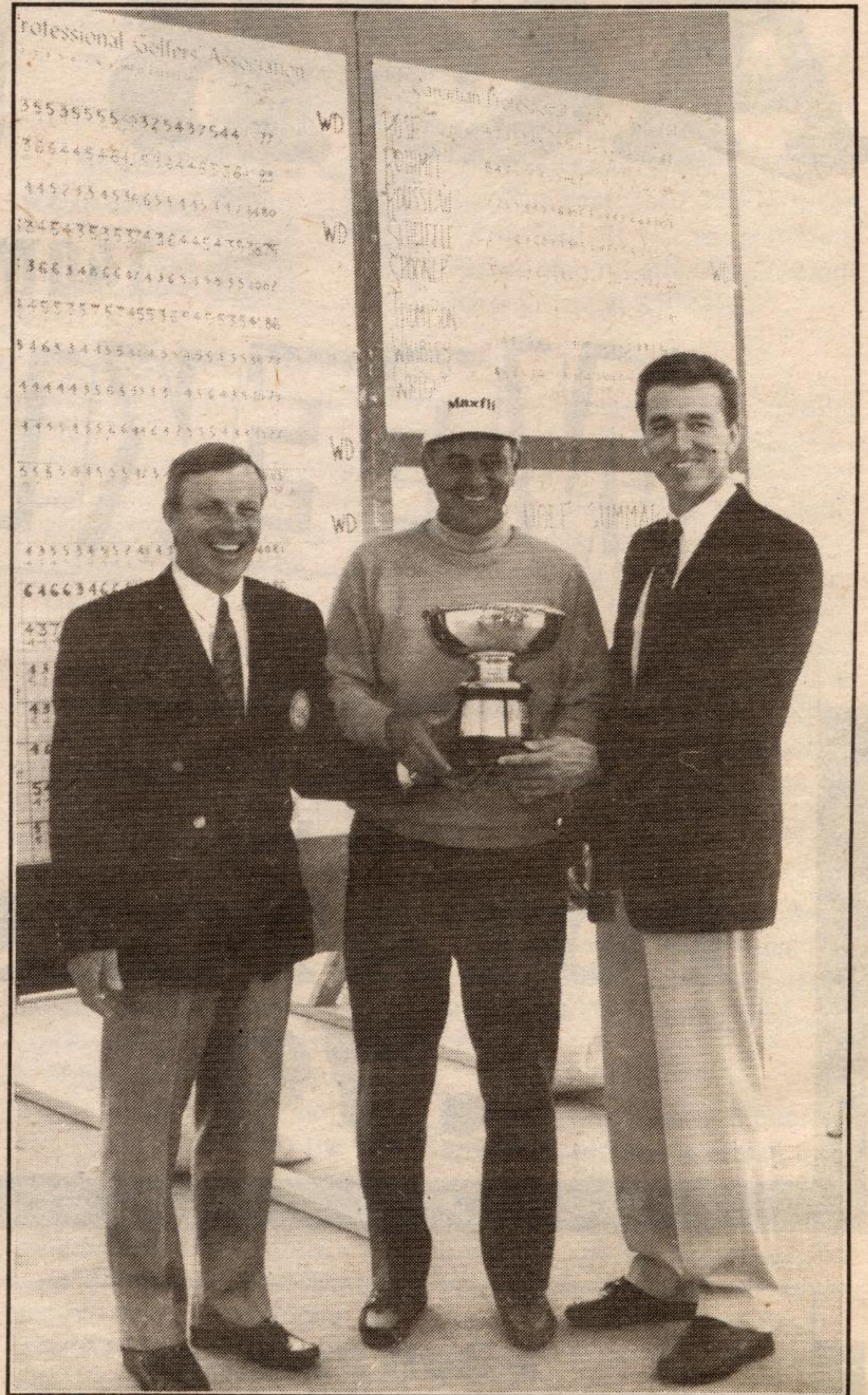

Sidewalk shovelling to become mandatory

Acton residents and merchants will eventually be forced to shovel their sidewalks following a local handicapped man's successful appeal to the Ontario Human Rights.

Former Georgetown resident Neil Brookbanks argued it was

unsafe for handicapped people to get around in the winter because the Town did not adequately clear sidewalks.

Although the O.H.R.C. decision only affects sidewalks in the area of the Georgetown Market

Place, Mayor Millersaid the Town will eventually approve a bylaw forcing residents and businesses to shovel their sidewalks. Town Council earlier rejected such a bylaw because it would have been too costly to enforce.
