## No time off for local figure skating star

Balmy breezes and wet weather did not dampen the youthful exuberance of several competitive skaters with the Acton Figure Skating Club. While many young people spent their summer swimming, roller-blading or just plain "lazing around," these youngsters were participating in rigorous skatingtraining programs that sometimes left them sore and tired, but even more determined and motivated to be the best that they can be.

One such skater is Krista Petty of Rockwood, whose hard work and spirit paid off recently when she placed second at the Ontario Central Section Summer Competition in Thornhill in August. Krista competed in the Pre-Novice Ladies Freestyle category.

Krista continues to make successful leaps and bounds within the skating community and this yearshe was one of the province's proud recipients of a bursary for up-and-coming skaters. The bursary is sponsored by the Ministry of Tourism and Recreation. Krista was selected by the Ontario Figure Skating's Development Committee as the recipient of the Enriched Training Assistance Award for talented summer skaters. This award is a culmination of the COS talent identification program in

which Krista has been an on-going participant of since March of this year. It all began with a selection committee from COS inviting top skaters to participate in the program, which consists of a figure, freeskate and interview elimination process. Skaters standing at sub-section level for the 1991-92 season are also taken into consideration.

Following the initial interview day, successful candidates were notified of a second participation day. Krista attended, finished with a sixth overall placing and qualified for a bursary.

Krista was also asked to try out for a freeskate pair team selection this summer. Although she qualified, Krista decided to forego pairs skating at this time because she would have had to move away from home, school, friends and family. Having just turned 14, Krista feels she will have plenty of time to follow that dream.

Krista recently passed twothirds of her Novice Competitive test acquiring, the Freeskate and Elements portions towards competing at the sub-sectional level of competition this fall. Krista has certainly proven her ability this year as an up-and-coming young skater. Krista is coached by Patte Boekhorst of Guelph.
