You can forget about smoking in the Acton Library. Changes to existing Town bylaws now prohibit smoking in the Acton Library and the Georgetown Library and Cultural Centre. Both facilities had designated smoking areas but in Acton it was never used because there were always library progams operating in it. All areas of both library facilities are now smokefree zones.

Bower condo plan revised

Owners of a 2.34 acre property on the north side of Bower Street at the end of Wilbur and Frederick Streets have revised their proposed plans for the land. The revised rezoning application now call for a six storey, 72-unit condominium apartment building. The original

proposal was for a two storey, 40unit apartment building. The applicant is working on floodline, storm water management, traffic impact and environmental studies. Once those studies are complete Town staff will report to Council on the proposal.

STOP!

This time next week residents of McDonald Boulevard should have some idea what is happening with their petition to have the Town install a stop sign at McDonald and Division Street. For the past year, ever since Division was opened up to McDonald, area residents have had to contend with what they claim is a dangerous corner. Town staff will report to committee members on the status of the petition on Monday, Oct. 5.

Improvements for 6th Line

After five accidents in as many years, Town staff has recommended safety improvements to a three-kilometre stretch of the Sixth Line north of Highway 7. The problem area is a horizontal curve on a slight hill about 2.1 kilometres north of the highway. Although there are Winding Road and Hidden Driveway signs in the area now, staff will install pedestrian advance warning signs facing northbound and southbound traffic entering the built-up residential area where the majority of the accidents have occurred. Chevron signs and delineator alignment guidance markers will also be installed in the area to guide motorists through the sharp curve where the accidents have occurred.

Yes or No on Constitution question

Halton-Peel MP Garth Turner wants to make sure local voters make an informed choice when they vote Yes or No in the Monday, Oct. 26 national referendum on Canada's Constitution.

On that day, voters across the country will be asked this question: "Do you agree that the Constitution of Canada should be renewed on the basis of the agreement reached on Aug. 28, 1992. Yes or no?"

"The question may be simple enough," Turner said last week, "but there are many complex issues behind it which everybody should be given an opportunity to debate. I believe it's my responsibility to do all I can to stimulate that debate, while making sure every effort is put into providing people with the information they need to arrive at their own deci-

riding focussing on the proposed changes to the Constitution to give voters a chance to review the proposals, get documents and raise questions and comments.

Turner says it is not his job to tell people what to do or to try to take a leadership role on the issue but he is urging anyone interested in joining the "Yes" vote to call his constituency office.

"My initial and most important role is to provide information and pose questions people should be asking themselves. But should my fears be realized, then I may be forced at a later date to enter the debate in a vigorous way to address any delicate distortions."
