



## Acton's first annual Puck and Ball Tourney

Three members of the Acton High cross country team ran great races at the Bishop Reding Invitational meet at Milton's Kelso Conservation area last Wednesday.

Grade 9 student Amanda Bonnell, running her first high school race, placed 10th in a field of 107 in the Midget Girls 3,200 metres.

In the Midget Boys 5,200 metre race, Michael Andrews ran 33rd in a field of 170. That is his best

finish so far this season.
