## Lou Gehrig's disease — deadly reminder of our mortality

Many, older ball fans will recognize the name Lou Gehrig — the so-called "iron man" of baseball who held his own alongside even

the great Babe Ruth, only to succomb to the disease which today bears his name. The same condition killed David Niven, the famous British actor.

Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (or ALS) is a relentlessly progressive and irreversible disease of the nervous system. Persons who suffer the disease eventually lose the use of all voluntary muscles and eventually they cannot move, breathe or eat without support systems. Sometimes, sufferers from ALS become totally paralyzed. There is no known cure and no available therapy which will even slow the progression of the disease.

Apparently, a high incidence of ALS is found in naval veterans; of 46 men once stationed in Halifax only six are alive today. In their cases, the onset of the condition was thought to be related to the use of chemicals used to disinfect ships during the second World War.


