

Rennie withdraws motion on referendum

Lack of support forced Acton Councillor Gerald Rennie to abandon plans to ask his fellow councillors to vote for a resolution in support of the Yes side in the Constitutional referendum.

Rennie, wearing a Yes button on his lapel, raised the issue Monday night, asking Halton Hills General Committee to make public its opinion on the controversial issue.

"People are being bombarded with arguments from both sides," Rennie explained. "I have been approached by people with desires for advice. We should offer leadership and Council should make public its opinion, if it can reach a consensus on the issue."

Councillor Ann Currie led the move to refuse to deal with the motion. "I am voting Yes but we have no right to advise anyone else (how to vote) and neither does Council. Is this motion out of order?" Currie asked. "We have absolutely no right to do this. This puts me in a difficult position. I support the Yes side but can't vote in favour of this. It is a big mistake and an intrusion."

The same sentiments were echoed by the Mayor and other councillors, some of whom were wearing Yes buttons. When it became clear that General Committee did not want to deal with the issue, Rennie withdrew his motion.
