and a real defensive struggle.

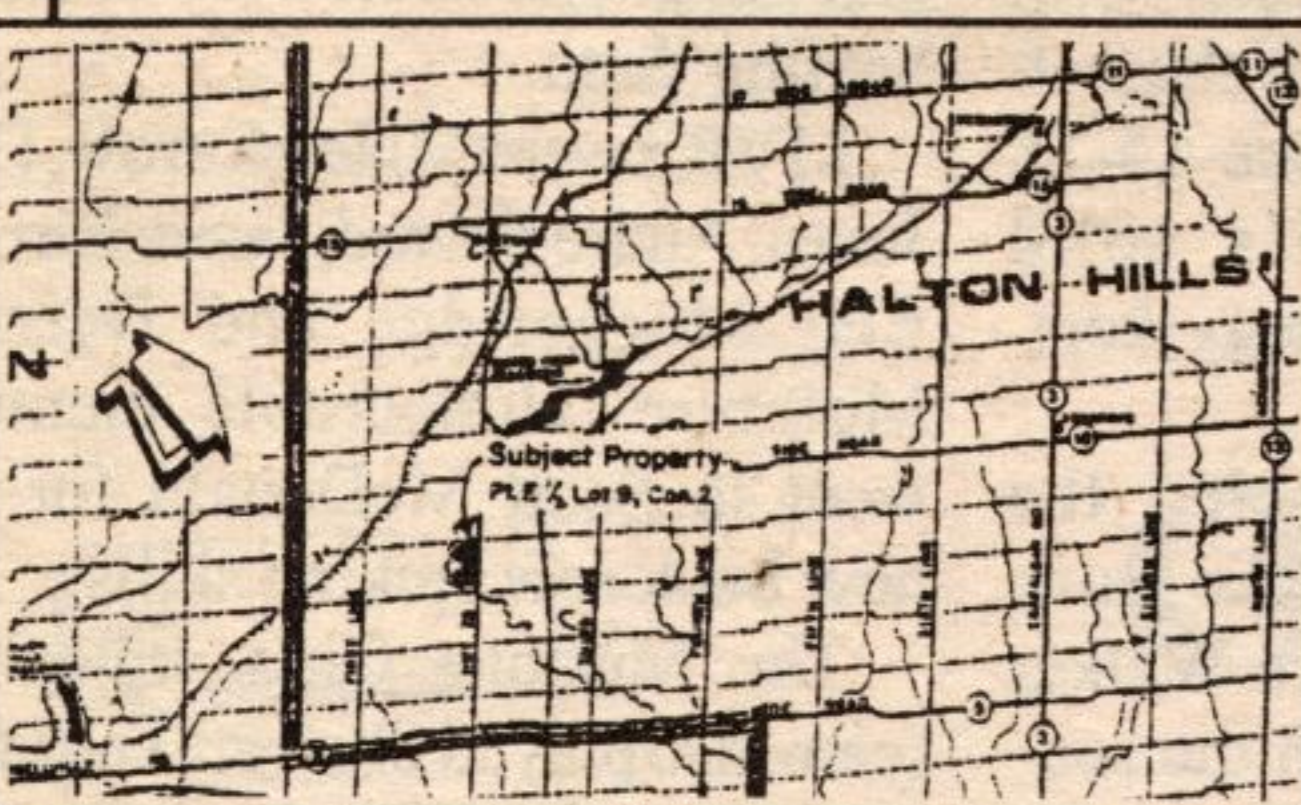
David Gregson had a great game for Acton. The game sheets did not identify the Acton scorer.

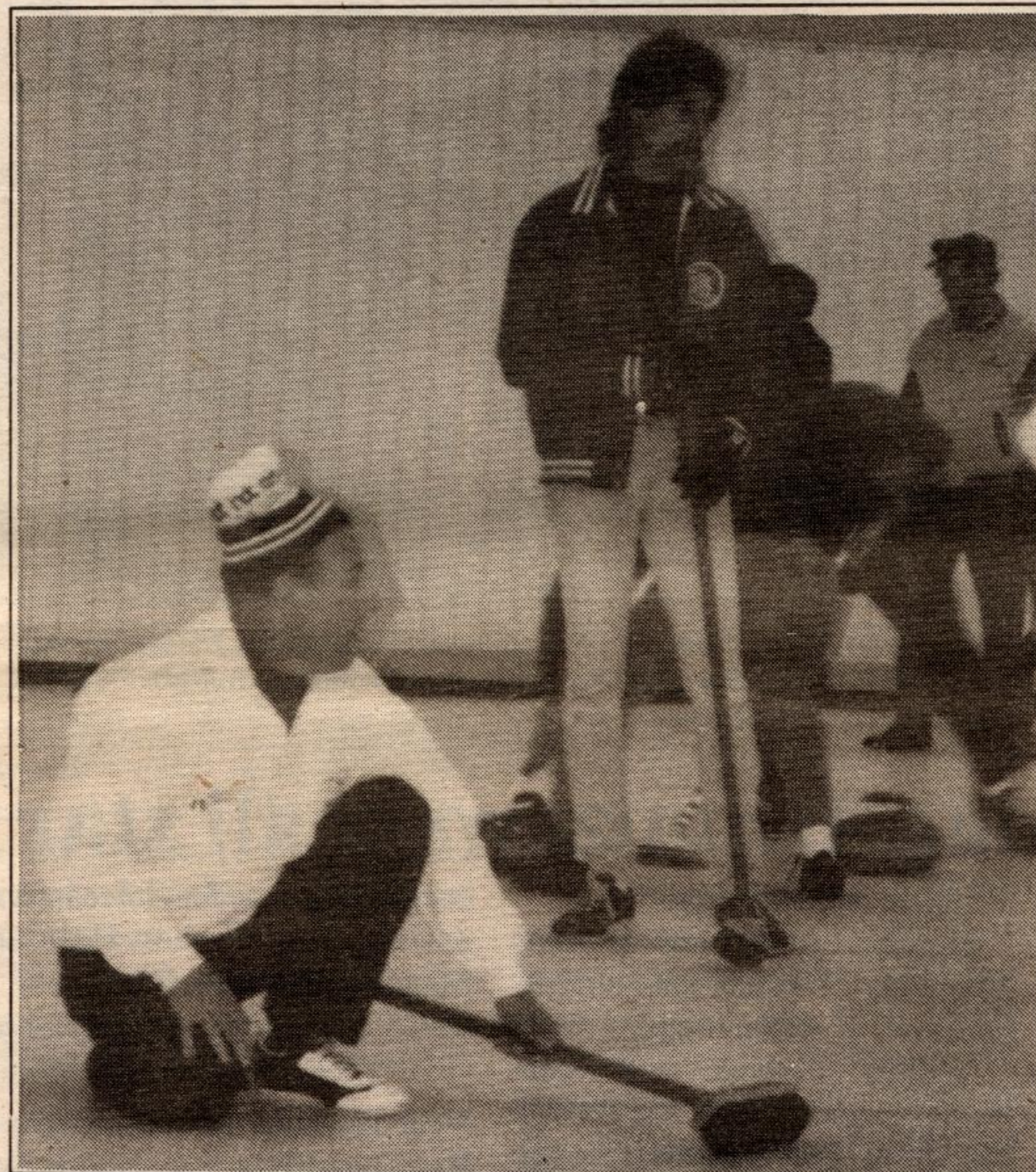
