board will be strong and keep the Club viable and healthy for the community," Chumley said in an interview Thursday. "We had more people out this year than we've had in the last five years."

Chumley said one of the first issues the new board will have to deal with is last year's merger of the girls' teams with Georgetown and the proposed merger of the boys' teams.

"I feel that Georgetown has problems with numbers and putting together girls teams and also have concerns about the quality of soccer. It's not really competitive, we do have some select teams, but some day we would like to see it competitive," Chumley explained.

When asked if the amalgamation of the girls teams would continue, Chumley said that would be looked at by the new board.
