In other Novice play on Saturday Galvcast managed an 8-6 win over MacMillan's Frozen Foods.


The Galvast squad jumped to a commanding lead on the offensive strength of Mike Rowsell, who had five goals and one assist.

London scored in the second period to tie the game and in the third period the Sabres' Andrew Pembleton found the net with help from Mike Dube and Weatherall.


London then came back to tie it again. A strong defensive game was played by David Brooks.
