Tim Pembleton with a pair, Candice Anderson and Darryl Wright had the helpers.

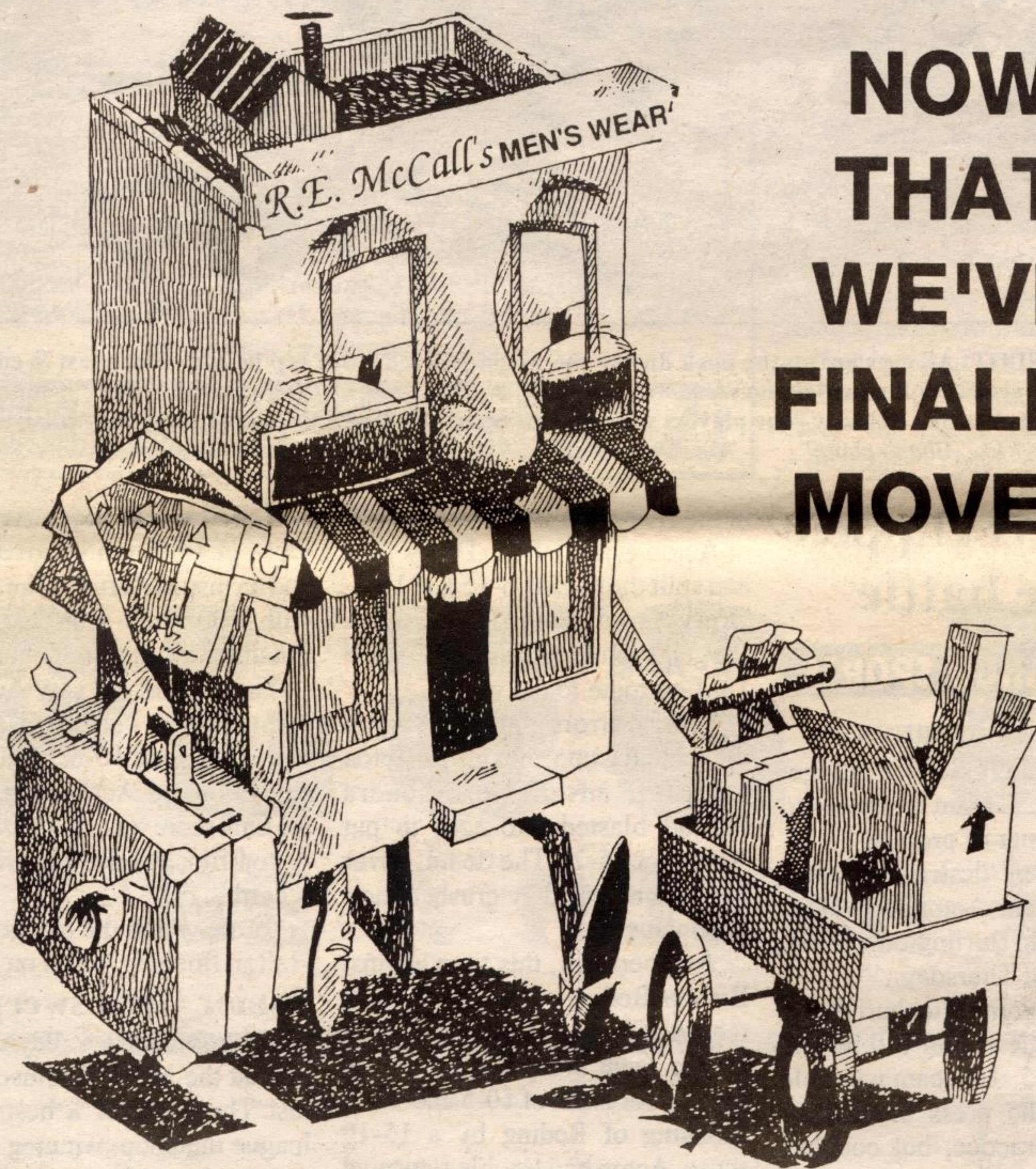
