now spell his name with a "C" so the new company name was still their initials, said he would be happy not to use the name KLAN-data ever again.

"I feel we are living in a free country and I really understand that people try to take care of this nice country and I'm glad that they are doing that. That is the only reason why we have changed the name. I think Canada is a great country and it's great that people want to keep out, those that try to destroy it with racial hatred."

Larsen said they will not change the name of the arm of their company that sells the firm's software in Europe.

Highway 7, east of Churchill Road and will include a major plaza with a 40,000 to 45,000 square foot department store and a 25,000

square foot food store.

Council also supported a consultant's recommendation to allow a 17,500 square foot commercial development on Queen Street at

the old Ajax plant, now owned by Freure Management.

Debate over development in Acton centres on water and sewer allocations. The Province said Acton must not grow beyond 10,000 people because there is only enough water for that many.

Using planning formulas, that means there is capacity for 563 new housing units in Acton. The various developers in town are objecting to each other's plans, arguing that they should be allocated more of the units.

Town Council hopes to approve the Acton land use and boundary studies before the OMB hearing in June.

Baby death probe continues

A coroner's investigation into the sudden, unexplained death of a 7-month-old Acton boy continues.

The baby, who police will not identify, died at Hamilton's McMaster Medical Centre last Tuesday. He had been taken to Georgetown Hospital by ambulance but was transferred to Hamilton when his condition worsened.

An autopsy did not pinpoint the cause of death and police report it will take several weeks for results of further forensic tests.

A potentially life-saving heart transplant, from the baby to another ailing infant, had to be cancelled at the last minute after the investigation was launched.

Tools taken on Willow Street

Police are investigating the disappearance of \$3,000 worth of tools from the back of a pick-up truck, parked outside a Willow Street house last Tuesday night.

The truck owner told police the 200-pound tool box, and assorted hand tools, were in the rear of his truck when he parked at a friend's house. He told police when he came back four hours later, the tool box was gone.

Laundered cash heist

Late last Monday night a suspect pried open the coin box on the top of a triple load washing machine at the Relaxo Coin Laundry and made off with \$200 in quarters.

The Main Street South laundromat was open at the time of the theft. Police have no suspects or witnesses.

Video furnace overheats

A smoky furnace triggered a fire alarm at Acton Video Superstore on Main Street early Sunday morning.

The furnace malfunctioned and set off the alarm at 8:25.

Firefighters quickly cleared the smoke and the furnace has been repaired. No damage was done.
