"After we build one house in a developed community, 10 per cent is given back to the Habitat for Humanity World Fund that we take and build houses in Jamaica or El Salvador," said Martin, who believes everyone deserves a decent and safe place to live.

"Habitat for Humanity Canada draws in all sectors of society—rich and poor—sweating together to build homes," explained Martin, adding "Canada was built with Canadians helping each other."
