game would be low-scoring.

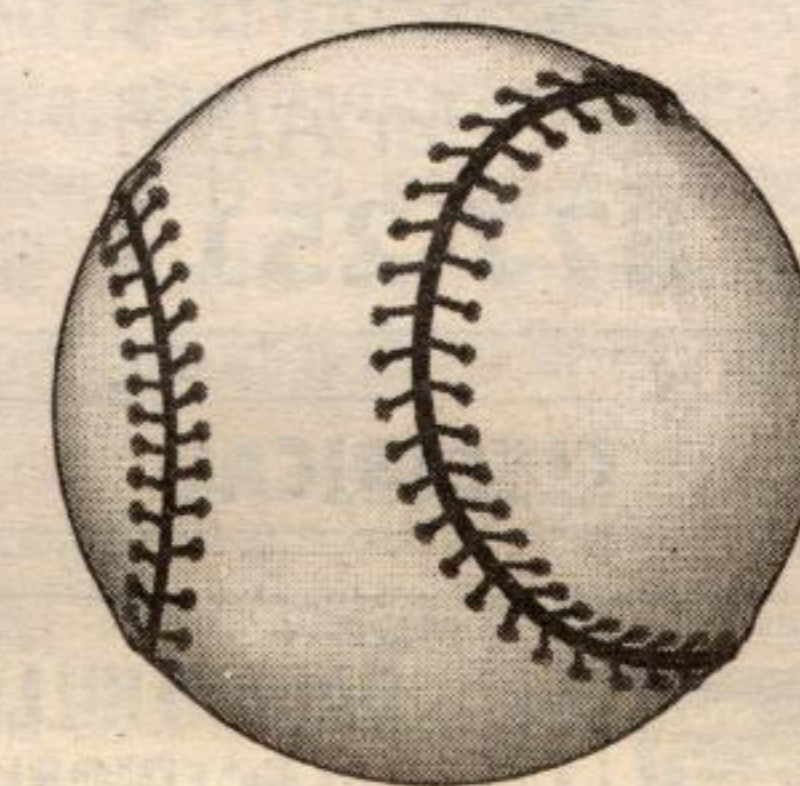
However, Westaway put the visitors on the board first before the roof caved in and Acton surrendered five unanswered goals.
