Kim Basinger and Gabriel Byrne star in this fast-paced combination of animation and live action. Basinger plays Holli Would, a voluptuous'toon who seeks to seduce Jack Deebs (Byrne), the artist who created her, so that she can escape from Cool World in to the Real World. The animation, though not on par with Disney's budget-busting Roger Rabbit, is well-done and carries some strong doses of black humour, which may not be suitable for young children. The sound-track is made up of music from the "alternative" set, with groups such as Ministry, Pure, Electronic and Moby performing singles. Thin on plot, but thick on action, Cool World is, if nothing else, an exciting piece of entertainment. Rated PG-13, 90 minutes.


