Ray Liotta and Keiffer Sutherland star in this comedy-drama about the staff of a war-veteran's hospital and their struggle to give proper care to patients, many of whom are ignored or turned away because they do not meet government standards for injuries sustained in combat. Liotta plays Dr. Richard Sturgess, head of the "rebel" doctors who seek to treat every veteran, regardless of regulations. In order to do so they "turf" patients — sending them to other wards with fake diagnosis until they can be properly treated, fake sugical requisition forms and steal medical equipment. Sutherland plays Dr. Peter Morgan, new to the hospital and its unusual routine. Caught between dreams of private practice and the model of self-sacrifice that Sturgess represents, he finds himself the unwilling pawn of the hospital administration, who want illegal activity stopped. Article 99 is a super film with memorable

characters and interesting moral questions about treatment of war veterans.
