

Final Analysis Richard Gere, Kim Bassinger and Uma Thurman co-star in this taut suspensethriller about two women who seek to commit the perfect murder by pulling wool over the eyes of Dr. Isaac Barr (Gere), a psychiatrist expert in pleabargaining on grounds of temporary insanity. Duped into believing Heather Evans (Bassinger) suffers from alcohol-related psychosis, he unwittingly prevents her conviction for the murder of her husband, only to find that he is to be framed for it. Final Analysis moves with Hitchcock-like pace and direction, ending in a unique way that leaves you spellbound. Rated R, 125 minutes.

Mr. Baseball

Tom Selleck and Aya Takahashi star in this lighthearted comedy about a baseball player named Jack Elliott (Selleck) who, because of his age and ailing game, is to be traded away for a hot-shot rookie. The only team that will take him though, is in Japan! Once there Jack suffers from some of the biggest shocks of his life as cultures clash and the playing field becomes alien territory. Aided by a superb supporting cast and a refreshing script that doesn't make a joke out of every cultural difference, but tries to take a serious tack, Mr. Baseball is that rarity of rarities: A good sports flick. Rated PG-13, 168 minutes.
