case like this," Howes said in an interview on Friday.

"It was a terribly hard challenge to go back that far but it was made easier because the family were United Empire Loyalists. I located Lucretia and another relative and informed them of the issue and they made a claim for the money. I'm delighted they won and I imagine the Town is a little sheepish at sending a registered letter to a man that had been dead for over 100 years," Howes said.

Although Rowe was one day late in claiming the money from the tax sale, the Justice ruled she was not "lax or dilatory" in persuing her rights and therefore was entitled to the money.

Usher is puzzled by the ruling. "There was no authority for the initial judge to order us to advertise the action in the newspaper. We just did that to be Good Samaritans. This could have far-reaching repercussions."

The Justice also ruled that the Town cannot claim any money for maintenance work, tennis courts and fences installed on the property, because it did the work, without doing a title search to prove that it owned them.

The Town has 30 days to appeal the judgement.

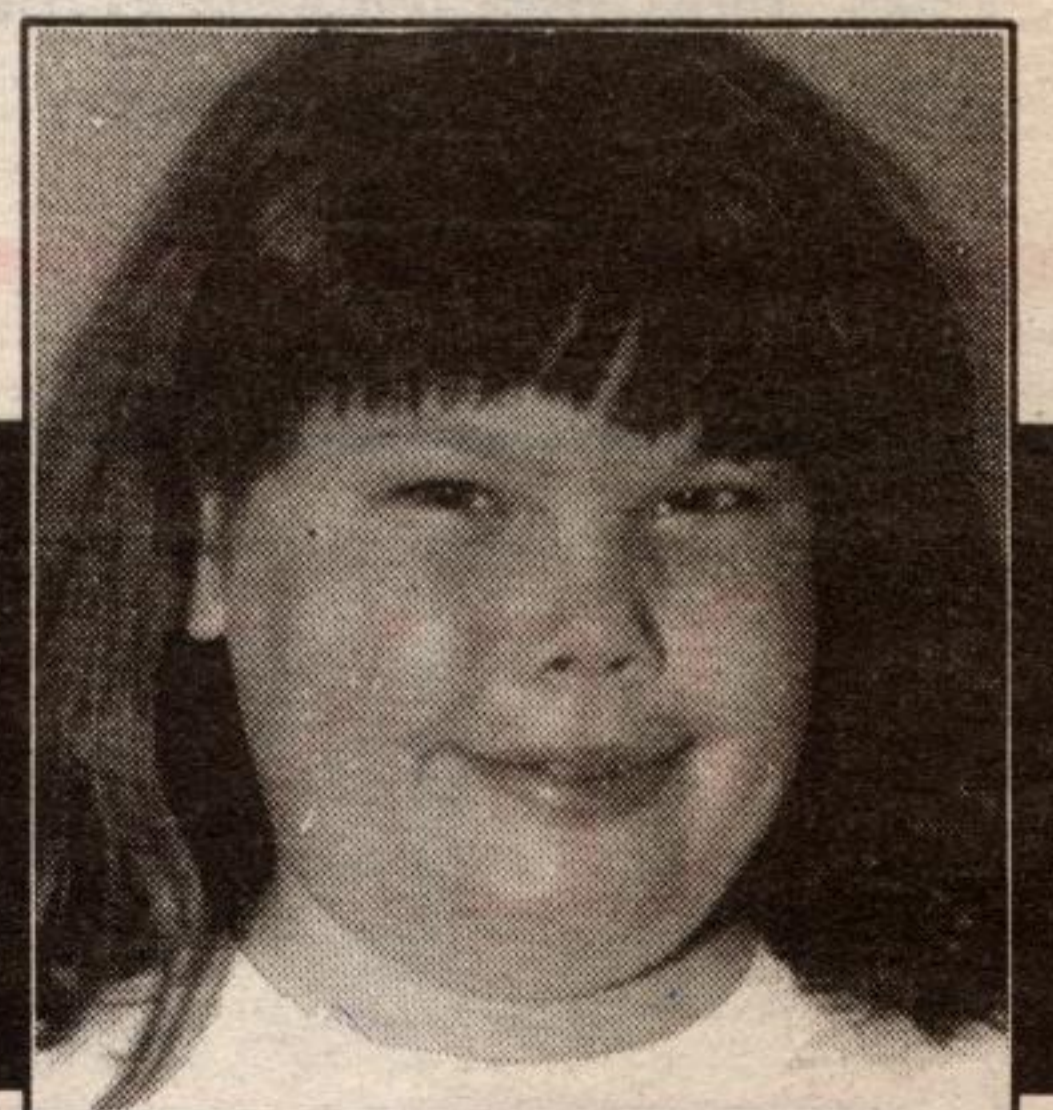
