

Lethal Weapon III

Sequels seem to be a dime a dozen these days and are almost always disappointing when compared to the original film. This is not the case with Lethal Weapon III. Mel Gibson and Danny Glover reprise their roles as the pair of hard-nosed detectives that seem to attract trouble like a magnet, this time up against a former cop who is helping arm the city's undesirables. All the chemistry of the original movie is here, along with the usual sprinkling of heart-stopping action. You can't possibly go wrong with this film. Rated R, 118 minutes, released in 1992.

Kevin Kline, Mary Elizabeth Mastrantonio, Kevin Spacey and Rebecca Miller star in this well-made thriller concerning the lives of two neighbouring upper-middle class couples. Kline plays Richard Parker, a musician who writes mediocre jingles for advertising, who finds himself being led down the path of adultery by his risk-taking next-door neighbour Eddie Olin (Spacey). Convinced by Eddie's arguments, Parker sleeps with Olin's wife, only to discover her dead the next morning. Murder, mystery and mayhem follow. Rated R, 99 minutes, released in 1993.
