The Department of National Defense argued that sailors are required to travel and Thwaites had to remain in Halifax for treatment.

Thwaites said the award means he will be able to buy a new home. He went bankrupt and lost his house after losing the Navy job.

A spokesman for the Navy in Ottawa says the Forces will study the decision before deciding whether to appeal.

Acton Councillor Rick Bonnette welcomed the news.



Sex assault guilty plea

A 20-year-old Acton man has pleaded guilty to sexual assault with a weapon in connection with an attack on a 15-year-old Acton girl on March 29.

Matthew Adlam will be sentenced on Friday, July 9 in Oakville Court after entering a guilty plea at his preliminary hearing on Thursday.

The Crown withdrew related charges of possession of a dangerous weapon, forcible confinement, uttering a death threat and breach of probation against Adlam.

Adlam was arrested after the victim, whose identity is protected by a ban on publication, was lured from her home and assaulted in a garage at a local industrial complex.

The Acton woman told police she was eating dinner with several co-workers when her husband entered the restaurant and allegedly began yelling and harrassing her.
