"Transportation is the biggest problem for people with disabilities," Hadfield says. "For many people, the GO train service was one of the attractions of moving to Acton. So many people are affected in different ways."

Hadfield maintains that the

Acton service would be more frequently used if the train was earlier. The train currently arrives in Union Station at 8:45 am.

Hadfield has written to the chairman of GO-Transit, Premier Bob Rae and Halton Hills town council addressing his concerns. He has yet to receive any responses.

"If I miss the bus I can't just jump in the car and drive to Georgetown," Hadfield says.
