



Con games and sweet-talk crimes

This scheme accounts for more than half of the confidence games reported to the police. The swindlers claim to have found a large sum of money and offer to share it with you. You are asked to withdraw "good faith" money from your bank. The swindlers take the "good faith" money and give you a phoney address where you are to collect your share of the found money. You never see them again.

Bank examiner

A phoney bank examiner contacts you and asks for your help in catching a dishonest bank employee. He asks you to withdraw a specified amount of cash from your

account so that he may check the serial numbers. After turning over your money to the examiner, you never hear from him again.

Door-to-door sales

Many door-to-door sales are not legitimate. Provincial laws protect you against quick sales at your door. Enquire and be sure.


