Toys

Robin Williams stars in this whimsical, but disappointing, comedy about a toy factory in crisis. The man who conceived Zevo Toys is dying and has only his son Leslie (Williams) to leave the firm to. He feels that Leslie is too "immature" to handle the job, so he hands it over to his militaristic brother General Zevo (Michael Gambon) until Leslie can take on the responsibility. Predictably, the General decides he wants to make war toys, and it's Leslie's job to stop him from ruining the sparkling reputation of Zevo Toys.

The Lawnmower Man

Pierce Brosnan lends weight to this jerkily directed sci-fi thriller as scientist Lawrence Angelo. Angelo has been experimenting with virtual reality, trying to make chimpanzees smarter through drug therapy and speed learning techniques. When his third chimp is killed by the military organization that funds his research, he goes underground and begins to treat the mentally challenged boy (Jeff Fahey) who cuts his lawn. The results are astounding. Is this the next step in human evolution?
