FONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD

IN THE MATTER OF numerous matters dealing with the Acton community;

TAKE NOTICE that the Ontario Municipal Board will hold a hearing commencing June 28, 1993 at 10 am in the Council Chambers at the Civic Centre (Georgetown) of the Town of Halton Hills, located at 1 Halton Hills Drive, Halton Hills (Georgetown).

It is anticipated that the hearing will deal with the following Official Plan Amendments adopted by the Town on June 7, 1993, in addition to matters already pending. Separate notice has been given for those pending matters.

The Official Plan Amendments implement two studies referred to as the "Halton Hills Land Use Study" and the "Residential Implementation Study for the Acton Urban Area," which studies contain growth management recommendations. The Official Plan Amendments are as follows:

- 1. Official Plan Amendment No. 44 contains General Residential policies;
- 2. Official Plan Amendment No. 45 contains General Commercial policies;
- 3. Official Plan Amendment No. 53 contains phasing policies;
- 4. Official Plan Amendment No. 54 contains policies with respect to the development of Acton East;
- 5. Official Plan Amendment No. 55 contains policies with respect to the development of Acton West;
- 6. Official Plan Amendment No. 57 contains policies with respect to the commercial development on lands owned by Coscan (Part of Lot 27, Concession 4);
- 7. Official Plan Amendment No. 58 contains Commercial policies with respect to the commercial development of lands owned by Freure (Lots 305 and 306, Registered Compiled Plan 1098, 252 Queen Steet).

The separate matters pending at the Ontario Municipal Board include Official Plan Amendments, Rezoning and Subdivision matters to permit the residential development of the following lands:

Described as Part Southwest 1/2 of Lot 27, Concession 4, Township of Esquesing, and Part of Lot 335, Registerd Plan No. 1098 and all of Lot 22, Plan M-49 (the Coscan Development Corporation lands);

Described as Part Lot 26, Plan No. 4 (the Bond Arch Development Inc. lands);

Described as Part Lot 242, registered Complied Plan 1098 (Acton), located on the south side of Wallace Street, Acton (the 547432 Ontario Limited lands);

Described as West 1/2 of Lot 29, Concession 2 (the Martin Goose, in Trust, lands);

And to permit the development of commercial land use on lands described as Lots 305 and 306, Registered Compiled Plan 1098, 252 Queen Street (the Freure Management Limited, in Trust, lands); and,

On lands described as part of Lot 27, Concession 4 (the Coscan Development Corporation lands).
