Janine Taylor and Becky Culp, with a penalty kick marker, scored for the Optimists.

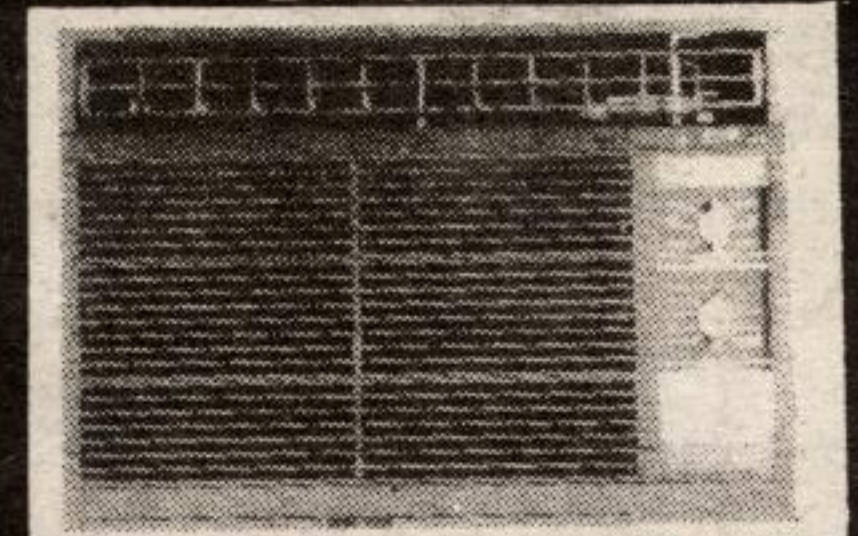
Scoring for the Poppacorns were Danielle King with a pair and Rhonda Myers.
