## Heritage workshops planned for fall

If there's a heritage site that you feel is integral to Acton and Heritage Halton Hills doesn't know about it, pencil in the autumn for some important workshops.

Through funding from the Town of Halton Hills and the Ontario Heritage Foundation, Heritage Halton Hills, formerly called Local Agricultural Conservation Advisory, Committee (LACAC), is introducing a project to find out what the citizens of Acton feel is of heritage value in the rural areas of the Niagara Escarpment.

There will be approximately 20 available spaces for the workshops. For people who can't attend the workshops, Heritage Halton Hills consultant Pamela Kaufman says there will be an open forum after their completion for other views to be heard.

"We have a new outlook to preserve buildings and the context around them," says Kaufman, who adds the workshops will let people explain what they think is of her-

itage value and discuss issues that they feel are important in the preservation of rural landscapes.

Heritage Halton Hills is a citizens' committee that advises Town Council on any matter relating to the designation and conservation of heritage resources.

Kaufman says there will be a document in about four months of what people feel is important. It will then be brought to a formal discussion on their concerns and what they consider important about heritage preservation.

"We have a vision to prepare for the future through conducting inventories and identifying heritage properties rather than only reacting to requests or threats," Kaufman explains.
