However, Woolwich tied the game at two with 10 minutes remaining.


Goralewski missed a chance to tie the game in the late stages off a Petkoff pass.

Goalie Derrick Inscoe, midfielder Ryan Bowen, Jakub Wiktor and fullback David Hatch put forth solid efforts.









