

# Recycling for rural Acton

Councillor Rick Bonnette told Monday's Council a new "Igloo Recycling Depot" for rural areas west of Hwy. 7 will be operating in Acton by mid-September at no cost to the taxpayers.

Local farmers will now be able to recycle without travelling long distances, announced the councillor, who has been concerned for some time about farm areas being left out of the recycling program.

A minimum of three igloos will initially be set up on Churchill Road, next to the Acton Wastewater Treatment Plant laneway entrance, to recycle material now being collected in the curbside Blue Box program.

"This is a real advantage to people in rural areas," Coun. Bonnette told Council. "Some people in Acton can also use them (the recycling igloos) if their Blue Boxes are full, but this is primarily for rural areas."

Coun. Bonnette thanked Interprovincial Pipe Line Inc. for funding sponsorship of two igloos as part of the Halton Hills Public Works Department's "Adopt an Igloo" sponsorship program, and "two Regional staff members for pursuing my request" for more convenient rural recycling serv-

The igloos cost \$2,000 each, and formal sponsorship of the third igloo is expected soon, he said.


